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

SOBERING STATISTICS

About 80% of people who use heroin, first misused prescription pills.

70% of all addictions start in a family or friend's medicine cabinet.

EACH DAY...

cleaners, contractors, caregivers, your kids' friends and neighbors may be coming to your home.



Teens thinks abusing prescription drugs is safer than street drugs and that it is OK to occasionally abuse prescription drugs.



According to the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), stealing drugs from open houses is a technique drug thieves use to obtain prescription drugs.

Most commonly targeted medications include:

OPIATES: Pain killers and muscle relaxers like OxyContin and Vicoden.

DEPRESSANTS: Anxiety, depression and sleep medication.

STIMULANTS: ADHD Medications such as adderall.

The amount of prescription painkillers prescribed in 2020 was enough to medicate every adult in America around the clock for a month.

Nearly 15,000 people die of prescription overdoses annually in New Jersey, about 2/3 of drug related deaths.



40 Times More Likely A CDC study found that users of prescription drugs are 40 times more likely to use heroin than others, a figure that cements commonly prescribed medication as a gateway to more dangerous substances.
