Key Responsibilities

- Provide support in implementing and sustaining RFW initiatives, ensuring alignment with the contract and best practices
- Conduct data collection and analysis to measure program effectiveness and report outcomes.
- Coordinate and facilitate tailored training sessions for employers, community organizations, and stakeholders.
- Act as a liaison between employers and the organization to foster recovery-friendly workplace practices.
- Travel to various sites across Somerset County to engage with employers and conduct on-site support activities.
